Port 020

The following is a summary of the enhancements that have been implemented for this port.

Database upgrades (SQL only)

Why was this done?

This forms part of SYSPRO's scheduled database structure updates implemented from SYSPRO 7 Update 1 Port 005. This relates to SQL Server-based systems and was done in an effort to accelerate software development agility as some of the latest features required additional columns in existing tables and/or additional tables.



There are no changes to existing indexes, no data normalization and no changes to existing columns (such as renaming columns, changing data types, or changes to the actual data against each row).

What was done?

The following new columns and/or tables have been added:

How is it deployed?

Company-specific update

In addition to the actual application software containing new features, the port may include the following additional files:

- Updated data dictionary (BASE\DD_701\DDS*.*)
- Upgrade SQL script (BASE\SCRIPTS_SYSPR07_Update_701_???.sql)

When you load SYSPRO as an administrator and select to install the port, these files will be unzipped and copied to their appropriate folders.

You will receive a message indicating that a minor database upgrade is going to be applied and you will be requested to exit SYSPRO and reload one of your companies.

The login process compares the required database version defined in the data dictionary (DBV= entry in DDSCTL.TXT) with the current version defined in the company's database (AdmVersion..DatabaseVersion, key = 'CTL').

If the required data dictionary version is higher than the current company's database version, then the SQL upgrade script is applied (specified by the DBS= entry in DDSCTL.TXT).

The script must be located in the BASE\SCRIPTS folder and will be run with the elevated administrative privileges specified (System Setup > Database Tab > SQL Server system admin information).

The SQL script silently adds new columns and tables as required and updates the database version in the AdmVersion table.

The script typically only takes a few seconds per company, but may take a few minutes in some cases. Please allow the update to complete.

You will not be allowed to load your company before the company's database version matches the required data dictionary version.

Once the current company has been updated, the system reads all other installed companies (by looking at the ADMCTL files in the WORK folder) and attempts to run the upgrade script against each company. A correctly-installed system should allow the database upgrades to complete against each company's database.

However, in some environments (e.g. a support, test or developer environment) you may have configured many companies in the past and perhaps dropped their databases (to save space or because they are no longer required). In this case the upgrade process will display a warning that the upgrade script could not be applied and the remaining companies will be processed.

If you know about these unused companies then this is not a problem. However, if you expected these companies to be valid live SYSPRO companies, then you could logout of the current company and attempt to load the suspect company so that the upgrade is applied.

Once logged into SYSPRO, the minor database upgrades have been applied and any new features can be configured as required.

System-wide update

When you load SYSPRO, it detects whether the version of the system-wide database (SysproAdmin) is up-to-date. If not up-to-date, it runs a SQL script (BASE\SCRIPTS_SYSPRO7_Update_701_????_sys.sql). The script silently adds new columns and tables as required, and updates the database version in the AdmSysVersion table.

Why was this done?

There was a requirement to find key information quickly and easily.


Currently you select the Search button when looking for a customer, stock code or supplier, and a listview is displayed with the results related to the key field.

What was done?

Predictive search functionality has been added that provides a fast and efficient way to find information linked to a key field.

The results from the predictive search are based on values entered in a field. The more data that is entered the more refined the search results list becomes.

For example you can search in the Customer field using a customer code, name or short name, and if the value entered is contained in any of these fields, they will be returned in the search results.




The search applies to any field where you can browse for information. There is also the facility to customize and configure the search to user preferences and needs.

Switching on the feature

Ensure that the SYSPRO e.net WCF Communications Service is installed.

1. Navigate to the System-wide Personalization program (SYSPRO Ribbon bar > Administration > System-wide Personalization).



- 2. Enable the Use Predictive Search option.
- 3. Navigate to the System Setup program and define the e.Net Service Details.
- **4.** Define a search using key fields in the **Search Configuration** program (**Program List** > **SYSPRO Espresso** > **Espresso Search Configuration**). This can be used in both SYSPRO and Espresso.

New look enterprise search

Why was this done?

There was a requirement to improve the look and feel of the enterprise search.

What was done?

The following has been added to the Enterprise Search:

- A more modern look
- A filter that allows you to refine the search results based on a specific category
- A floating header that always displays the current category as you scroll through the search results
- A Copy function against the search results

Setup options consolidated into single program



Why was this done?

There was a requirement to improve the functionality and user experience of the traditional module setup programs within SYSPRO (e.g. with more than 20 different setup programs and a large number of different tabs, it was sometimes hard to remember the exact location of a setup option).

What was done?

The module setup programs have been consolidated into a single setup program and include a number of functions ranging from a quick search; to company comparisons and a file import/export:



Field/Option	Description	
Functions	Function	Description
	Compare to	This lets you compare the setup options of two companies. You can elect to only view options that differ between the companies. You can also generate a print preview or produce a comparison report between the companies.
	Import from	This lets you import setup options from another company.
	Export to a File	This lets you export your setup option selections from the current company to a text file. This lets you tweak options as required and import the file into other companies.
	Import from a File	This lets you import setup options from a text file (typically generated by exporting options from another company).

1. Navigate to the System-wide Personalization program (SYSPRO Ribbon bar > Administration > System-wide Personalization).

2. Enable the Use single setup program option and reload SYSPRO.

Once the functionality is enabled, you are routed to the new setup program whenever you select a setup program link from the **Ribbon bar** or the **Program List** pane.




Switching off this functionality at any time reverts to the previous style of loading SYSPRO module setup programs (i.e. the previous setup programs are still available).

You can still run the previous programs manually from the **SYSPRO Quick Menu** (**SYSPRO Button** > **Run a Program Ctrl + R**).

Since the two systems essentially use the same business objects, the integrity of changes you make using either method of navigation is not compromised.

3. Switch on the caption help facility by selecting the **Toggle showing form help** button (?) on the toolbar of the **Setup Options** program.



Getting help

The help for the program has been revamped to cater for a number of navigation preferences:

• Caption-level help

If you enable the **Toggle showing form help** button (?) then whenever you click on a field, the caption help for that field is displayed.

• Form-level help

Selecting the **Form Help** link from the caption pane displays all the fields for that form in a window. The form window can be resized and docked anywhere on the screen, or left floating. This lets you review all the fields for a form without having to click on each individual field to view the help documentation.

• Topic-level help

Selecting a topic link will display additional information about that topic in a window. The form window can be resized and docked anywhere on the screen, or left floating. Currently, there are only a few topics that have been compiled for publishing with the program. However, the number of topics will be increased substantially over time.

• Program-level help (i.e. F1)

The traditional F1 function will load the complete field help for the program and includes a link to a PDF file that consolidates all the setup options in one document.

Journal filter options

Why was this done?

There was a requirement to always use the filter options when printing journals, regardless of the print status.

Currently the filter options are only available when the **Reprint** option has been selected.

What was done?

- All journals that match the filter criteria specified on the **Report Options** tab will be printed.
- The **Reprint** flag on the report will indicate if a journal has already been printed.

All journals (whether previously printed or not) are included in the report according to the report options indicated. The **Reprint** column on the report indicates whether the journal was previously printed.

• The **Reprint** function has been removed.
